



MARINE HVAC-R TECHNICIAN

Job Description

The Marine HVACR_Technician will be responsible for the installation and repair of marine air conditioning and refrigeration systems on yachts. Under general supervision, you will conduct preventive maintenance, repair, installation, general servicing and commissioning of marine HVAC and refrigeration systems and components. This includes chiller and DX systems, walk-in and self-contained refrigerators and freezers, compressors, condensers, blowers, circulating and seawater pumps, associated piping, as well as electrical and related control systems. In this role, you will be expected to perform detailed troubleshooting of systems and provide diagnosis and solutions to remedy any reported deficiencies. Additionally, you will be expected to provide high levels of customer satisfaction while completing assigned work to meet departmental and other relevant standards.

Education or Required Experience

- Minimum 3 years of industry experience in the HVAC industry, ideally within the marine environment, troubleshooting, repairing and servicing air conditioning, refrigeration systems, and associated components.
- Experience with tight quarters oxy-acetylene brazing, shipboard hot work procedures, and related safety.
- 🔊 Skilled at troubleshooting, diagnostics and completing repairs for system malfunctions.
- Possesses a broad knowledge of a variety of HVAC electronic or digital controls systems. <u>Knowledge of electrical power systems and components</u>, both North American and European.

- Able to perform disassembly, cleaning, inspection and reassembly of pipework including the renewal or replacement of fittings, couplings, unions, adapters, <u>valves</u>, etc. as commonly found in marine HVAC pipework systems.
- x Able to descale and acid flush units, charge units, clean HVAC strainers and repair HVAC pipework.
- 120 High school or general equivalency degree (GED) required.
- Advanced marine repair coursework, minimum EPA certification of type I, II, or III. Universal certification preferred, HVAC and/or ABYC certifications.

Required Skills

- Ability to read and interpret a variety of documents furnished in written, oral, diagram or schedule form such as safety rules, operating and maintenance instructions, procedural manuals, schematics and associated symbols relating to electrical, HVAC, and piping.

- >>> Understands yacht and ship terminology, local and industry, e.g., port/starboard, bow/stern, etc. and can easily convey information in a common vernacular understood by other industry professionals.
- Description Able to complete all calibration and documentation associated with testing and repairs, including ability to write CFR's, reports and correspondence.
- Example 20 Conducts extensive self-study to improve and maintain technical proficiency and completes certifications as required by the company.
- Must be organized, attentive to details, and possess good problem-solving skills with an ability to work unaccompanied to effectively complete tasks.
- 🔊 EPA certified and experienced in handling compressed gases, CFCs, HCFCs, and HFCs.
- 🔊 Ability to safely and properly identify, recover, evacuate, and charge refrigerant circuits.
- Must be able to safely and effectively troubleshoot electrical power circuits including high and low voltage, alternating and direct current, as well as circuit components including contactors, relays, solenoids, capacitors, transformers, frequency drives, circuit boards, and controllers.

Preferred Skills

- № Possesses basic hand tools necessary for the trade, including gauges and meters, in both standard and metric formats up to 1 inch / 26 mm.
- Basic computer skills and the ability to add, subtract, multiply and divide all units of measure, using whole numbers, common fractions and decimals. An understanding of common European measurement systems such as metric, bar, and celsius.
- >> The ability to write condition found reports on boats, prepare estimates and plan projects through to completion is highly desired.
- Must have an excellent work ethic, attitude, and ability to maintain a high standard of workmanship.
- x Follow prescribed safety rules and OSHA regulations while maintaining a safe, clean work area.
- Must possess the ability to periodically board vessels in and out of the water, work steadily in confined spaces, climb, lift and move lumber, tools and supplies as necessary.

- Must be able to pass a drug test and background check.
